

Who are we?

We all have masters degrees in counseling. This means we meet with students regarding mental wellness issues. We are also college and career counselors. We do registration, class changes, scholarships, track graduation requirements, etc. We conduct groups as needed (divorce, grief, resiliency, etc). We also are guest presenters in classrooms and generally present on issues teachers/students/parents have deemed as valuable on our Needs Assessment survey conducted the previous year.

Why do we need school counselors?

School counselors help everyone at the school and community. We are your advocate to make sure student schedules not only lead to a diploma, but are in the best interest of the student's development to be a productive citizen. We are also a resource for those students needing help with anxiety, depression, or just motivation. We help with the college admissions process and advise on career choices. We do class changes, and advise on options to track graduation requirements. This year we will be offering groups for those needing help with divorce, grief, and developing resiliency. College & Scholarship Application Weeks

November 8-11 and 15-18

During these weeks, we want all seniors to complete at least one college application or scholarship application.

SUU is waiving their admission fee for you if you apply this month. Your counselor will meet you in the lecture halls at Skytime with the code.

There will be a college rep here each day. Check the schedule on the front page.

Do some research before and decide where you are interested in applying and what scholarships you want to apply for.

Sophomore CCR meetings Nov 14 - Dec 22

Parents, sign-up using the Online Scheduler link on the school website. This is your one-on-one meeting with the counselor to plan your junior and senior year! Check with your student to make sure you sign up during a class they can easily make up the work and don't have a test at that time!

*Resiliency Group (with Mrs. Porcelli and Mr. Blatter)


*Grief Group (with Mrs. Porcelli & Ms. Shaia)

College App Deadlines

Seniors: Get those applications in! We recommended applying to 2-3 colleges and other Higher Ed opportunities! Some priority deadlines are Dec 1st - check your StepUP booklet you received at College TOUR day for more info.

school! I love to read and play with make up in my free time. I enjoy being a school counselor because I get to do individual and group counseling with students here at the school, but I also have part of the summer off so that I can wake board and be on the lake as much as possible!

I am the lead advisor for HOPE squad. HOPE squad is a peer-to-peer support team. Students who are at-risk for suicidal behaviors are more likely to confide in a peer than an adult. The HOPE squad acts as the eyes and ears of the school, and provides a link between struggling students and adult help. Through research-based training, HOPE squad members are empowered to seek help and save a life. Students are nominated by their peers through a student poll. Students are asked to nominate peers that students feel comfortable going to in difficult times. My involvement in HOPE squad is the best part of my job. I get referrals regularly of students that may be in crisis and I am able to get them the help they need.

Utah State University and Utah Valley University will both take transcripts by email. University of Utah will take them electronically, but there is a form the student is emailed and it has a password on it. That needs to come to us. BYU, BYU-I and BYU-Hawaii only accept transcripts through the mail. As we learn how other colleges accept them, we will post it.
